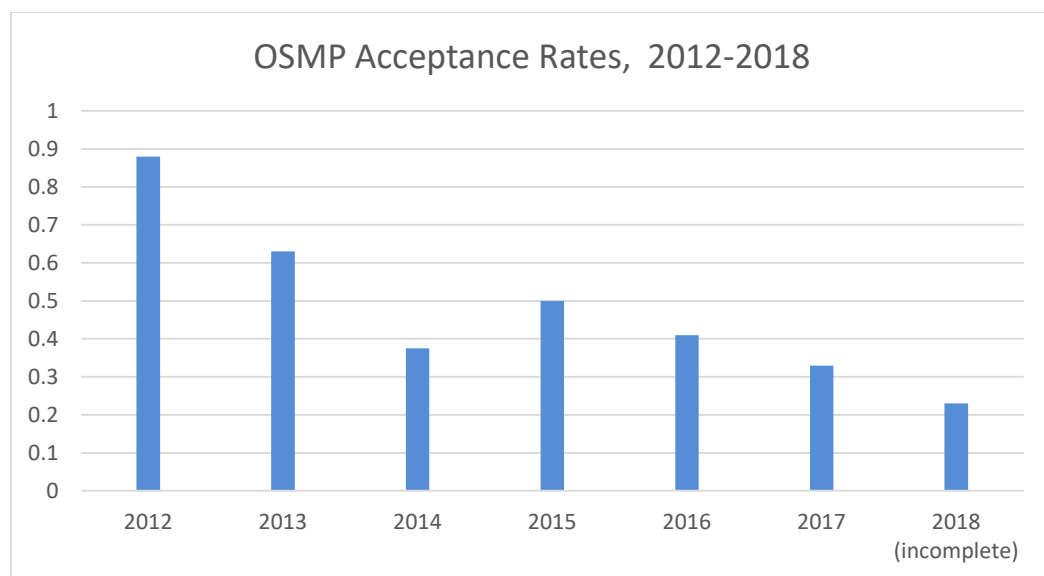


Oxford Studies in Medieval Philosophy Publication Data

Although OSMP is officially a monograph series, as far as Oxford University Press is concerned, the series operates like a journal in terms of being open to submissions and processing those submissions through a triple-blind refereeing process, to the fullest extent possible.

Acceptance Rate

Here, for the first seven years of operation, are the annual acceptance rates.



Because of the disparity over time, it seemed more helpful to give this information in a year-by-year format rather than by taking an overall average for all seven years. The main reason for the disparity is that the journal's first volume was filled entirely with invited contributions. That practice continued into the second year, and although it has not entirely ceased, it has diminished, which is the principal source of the falling acceptance rate. (Invited contributions go through the usual refereeing process, but have proved much more likely to be accepted.)

Total Number of Submissions

Beginning in 2014, submissions to the journal have held fairly constant, at 16, 18, 17, and 17. (This year, 2018, looks on track to be roughly the same.) Our hope is that these numbers will grow, and it will become unnecessary to solicit contributions, but that day is not yet here.

Response Time

Because of the variety of circumstances that can influence response time, it seems unhelpful to give an overall average, and more helpful to say that the vast majority of decisions are made within two months.
