The Argument from Naturalness

- P1. Eating meat is natural.
- P2. If an act is natural, then it's ok to do it. (NP)
- C. Therefore, it's ok to eat meat.

Possible counterexamples to the moral principle (P2):

- pedophiles
- murder
- walking around naked
- violence / war / domination
- rape
- P1. If NP is true, then if rape is natural, it's ok.
- P2. Even if rape is natural, it still isn't ok.
- C. Therefore, NP is not true.

The Argument from Naturalness (2nd version):

- P1. Eating meat is natural for the human species.
- P2. If an act is natural for a species, then it's ok for members of that species to do it.
- C. Therefore, it's ok for humans to eat meat.

The "other animals do it" argument

- P1. Other animals eat meat.
- P2. If other animals do a certain thing, then it's ok for humans to do it.
- C. Therefore, it's ok for humans to eat meat.

Counterexamples to P2:

- being aggressive
 - stealing territory
- cannibalism
- non-consensual sex
- mating in public
- masturbating in public
- eating one's young
- abandoning one's young
- killing one's mate
