The Argument from Pain and Suffering

- P1. It is wrong to inflict a great deal of pain and suffering on others for the sake of relatively minor benefits.
- P2. The meat industry inflicts a great deal of pain and suffering on animals for the sake of relatively minor benefits.
- C. Therefore, the meat industry is acting wrongly.

Let's work out M's meat-industry-friendly position:

M1:

When X is more intelligent than Y, it's ok for X to inflict great suffering on Y for sake of minor benefits.

Problem:

- the sadistic genius
- super-intelligent aliens

M2:

- (i) It is ok to inflict great suffering on beings whose intelligence is below a certain threshold for the sake of minor benefits for those above that threshold.
- (ii) that threshold is below humans but above the main animals that humans eat (e.g., pigs, chickens, cows)

Problem:

- the two CU students with headaches

M3:

- (i) It is ok to inflict great suffering on beings whose intelligence is below a certain threshold for the sake of minor benefits for those above that threshold.

- (iii) for beings that are above the intelligence threshold, their interests matter equally

Issue:

If a being is below the threshold of intelligence, does their pain matter a little bit or not at all?

M4:

- (i) It is ok to inflict great suffering on beings whose intelligence is below a certain threshold for the sake of minor benefits for those above that threshold.
- (ii) that threshold is below humans but above the main animals that humans eat (e.g., pigs, chickens, cows)
- (iii) for beings that are above the intelligence threshold, their interests matter equally
- (iv) for beings below the threshold of intelligence, their pain is only 1/1,000,000th as bad as equal pain caused to those above the intelligence threshold.

Problem:

Some humans are below the intelligence threshold.

M5:

- (i)* It is ok to inflict great suffering for the sake of minor benefits on beings who
 - (a) have intelligence below a certain threshold and
- (b) belong to a species normal members of which are below that threshold.
- (ii) that threshold is below humans but above the main animals that humans eat (e.g., pigs, chickens, cows)
- (iii)* for beings that are either above the intelligence threshold or are members of species for whom above-threshold intelligence is normal, their interests matter equally
- (iv) for beings below the threshold of intelligence, their pain is only 1/1,000,000th as bad as equal pain caused to those above the intelligence threshold.
